Alberta Helping Animals Society assists vulnerable people in and around Edmonton in accessing information and services for themselves and their companion animals by:

- Supporting various food banks around Edmonton

- Providing education on animal care, including nutrition, behavior, and enrichment

- Providing advice and advocacy for housing concerns

- Serving as a liaison between a wide range of community agencies and vulnerable people, helping find solutions for issues of animal and human welfare

- Working with pre-vet and veterinary students as they prepare to become leaders in the veterinary community

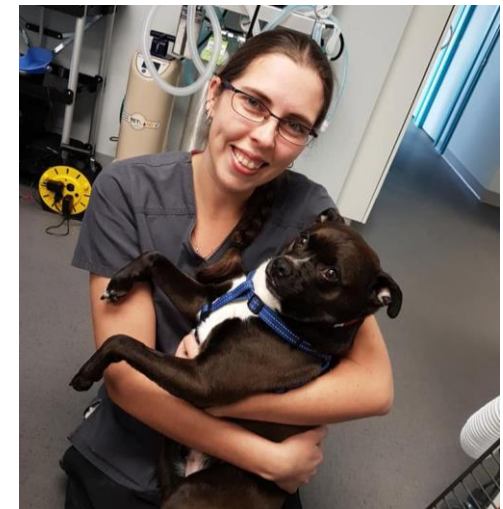

Alberta Helping Animals Society Home Veterinary Services provides no-cost veterinary services to people living with a very low income in Edmonton.

Our services include:

- Wellness examinations
- Vaccinations and parasite control
- Diagnostic sampling, x-rays
- Treating chronic conditions
- Surgery
- Dentals
- Palliative care
- Euthanasia



Volunteer veterinarians and registered veterinary technologists provide most of these services.

We mostly see animals in the clinic, but we go on some house calls.
